### THE ELEVATION SCHOLARS

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What does it mean to be an Elevation Scholar? What's the purpose of the award? Here's a deeper dive into the Elevation Scholars Award process and why we commit five years to walk alongside our students. Because it's not enough to help them get scholarships or gain acceptance. Our goal? To increase their college access and ensure successful completion of a college degree from the nation's most competitive colleges and universities.



### **High School Junior**

- Apply for the Elevation Scholars Award – a five-year commitment valued at \$25,000 for selected rising seniors.
   Funds are used for college admissions coaching and four years of wraparound support while students are in college.
- Participate in <u>Interview</u>
   <u>Day</u>, where the Scholars team will interview students, their parents, and teachers for acceptance into the program.
- Celebrate acceptance as an Elevation Scholar at our annual <u>Award</u> <u>Celebration</u>.

### **High School Seniors**

- Begin college admissions coaching
- Attend <u>Horizon Events</u>, where students are exposed to various career opportunities.
- Scholars announce their schools – <u>Decision Day</u>

### **College Students**

- College Success Coaches regularly check in with scholars to assist them in navigating their college environment, maximizing their college resources, and persisting. This includes the special touch of sending dorm kits for incoming freshmen.
- Receive monthly financial support in a customized package that funds things like airfare to come home for breaks, winter clothes, monthly spending stipend, and other academic needs.
- Referrals to program partners who support students' career connections by providing job shadowing, paid internships, professional mentoring, and other critical career development offerings.

## Colonial High School, Purdue University

Colonial High School graduate Darien is paving a new path for this family as a freshman at Purdue University. Double majoring in Actuarial Science and Applied Statistics with a minor in Management, there's no doubt that Darien excels in the classroom.

In high school, Darien maintained an impressive academic record, earning a 4.0 GPA and a weighted 5.0 GPA. He even shared the 10th rank with another topperforming student, which is a testament to the competitiveness at his school.

But for his Scholars family, what truly sets Darien apart is his remarkable personal attributes.

"Upon meeting Darien, it was evident he was an exceptional young man," shared Elevation College Coach Keycha Cruz Ocasio. "His sweet disposition, tireless work ethic, unwavering commitment to family, and ability to be a true friend to everyone he meets are just a few of his standout qualities. In my recommendation letter, I highlighted his remarkable skill in recognizing when people around him faced difficulties and his willingness to step up

and help. Darien is incredibly aware of his surroundings and possesses a high level of self-awareness, navigating the world with grace and humility."

But Darien's journey was far from easy. He faced various challenges along the way, and it was through his remarkable ability to adapt and his relentless problem-solving skills that he navigated those challenges.

Balancing his demanding work schedule and college preparations was yet another obstacle. While working part-time in customer service during high school, Darien had to manage his time effectively to excel academically, attend Elevation events, and prepare his college applications. It was daunting, but he handled it with remarkable composure and dedication.

Navigating the unfamiliar territory of colleges outside Florida posed another challenge for Darien. Like many of his peers, he didn't have a vast understanding of schools beyond his home state. Finding colleges aligned with his academic goals and social interests required some exploration, which he approached with determination and an open mind.

"Elevation Scholars has impacted my life in many ways," Darien shared. "With the help and support from Elevation, they showed me how much more potential I had. Elevation's many resources and support made the transition easy and allowed me to live out a dream I never thought I would have had."

### **SCHOLARS SPEAK: REFLECTIONS FROM A COLLEGE SCHOLAR**


## Oak Ridge High School, Brandeis University

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### **SCHOLARS SPEAK: REFLECTIONS FROM ALUMNI**

## Evans High School, Wake Forest University

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From the great Evans High School, I made my way to Wake Forest University in North Carolina, thanks to the assistance provided by Elevation. Today, I serve as a legislative staffer in Congress, where my primary role is that of a Legislative Correspondent. In this role, I handle our correspondence program, which involves interacting with constituents and addressing their inquiries, comments, and messages about current policies and programs.

One significant aspect of my role is translating complex legislative matters into straightforward, accessible terms for constituents. I believe in ensuring that everyone understands what's happening in Congress. In addition to this, I manage a policy portfolio, focusing on bills, writing, and collaborating with other offices on sponsorships and ideas.

I encountered the Elevation Scholars program around my sophomore year in high school. I was drawn to their high school programming events and the opportunity to join. Elevation Scholars played a pivotal role in my college preparation, helping with test prep, financial aspects like application fees, and guiding me through the application process. They broadened my horizons and opened my eyes to out-of-state schools, which I wouldn't have considered otherwise. Elevation Scholars extended my opportunities and ensured I didn't limit myself to my immediate surroundings.

As for my future plans, I'm still early in my career on Capitol Hill, and over the next year, I look forward to expanding my knowledge and experience as a legislative staffer. In the next five years, I see myself returning to school for either a law degree or a master's degree in a specialized field of public policy. If I pursue law, I aspire to work in the South, focusing on criminal defense and civil rights law. I genuinely love Washington, D.C., and the DMV area, and I intend to engage in more volunteer work and community service to give back to this vibrant community.

Reflecting on my experiences and the opportunities Elevation Scholars provided, I'm inspired to give back to young Black women in similar situations. I dream of establishing a scholarship fund to support those who aspire to attend their dream schools, especially historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs). Spelman College has a special place in my heart, and I envision creating a fund for young women who face financial barriers in fulfilling their dreams. If not, I'd like to create a fund for my alma mater to benefit Black students and organizations. I'm also keen on building a network of Black alumni to facilitate giving back to the community that made me who I am.

Elevation Scholars now has 33 alumni. Of those alumni who have entered the workforce, 68% have done so in Central Florida.

### HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAMMING



In addition to our awards program, we provide a mix of after-school and in-school programing with the goal of creating a college-going atmosphere throughout our partner high schools. This allows students to gain insight into the college admissions process to decrease the information deficit surrounding the process. Last year, we served over 225 students at Evans, Edgewater, and Jones High Schools. Sessions included resume-building, group coaching, community service, and college application support.

He is co-founder and Executive Director at Florida College Access Network, an independent statewide organization hosted by the University of South Florida that engages communities to improve college access and success for all students.

As a leader in the space of student success and equity in higher education, he recognizes the importance of organizations like Elevation Scholars.

Although Elevation continues to make a transformative impact, Colon acknowledges there is still much work to be done.

"Florida's success hinges on increased state investment in education and need-based financial aid. We have abundant talent and potential, but we burden families with inadequate support. There's much work to be done in our state, and leaders must be well-informed by the data."

Colon applauds Elevation Scholars for working to build a model that other organizations can look to as a blueprint.
